In this situation, the education play a vital role in reduction of poverty but unfortunately it is difficult to get their tertiary education for low-income family students, therefore, GCWUS is taking special measures to facilitate this type of deserving students who cannot afford their education.

FINANCIAL AID OFFICE (FAO)

To assist economically marginalized students, the university has established a Financial Aid Office (FAO) that deals various scholarship programs. This office makes sure that no student has to leave the University due to financial issues.








Ehsaas Scholarship Undergraduate Program Phase-I and Phase-II



CLINICAL CASE FORMULATION

The workshop was organized by the Department of Psychology. This was a oneday workshop held on August 12th 2022, from 10 am to 2 pm in Video conference room, GC Women University Sialkot. Dr. Umara Rauf (The Incharge/HOD) welcomed the resource person, Dr. Tanveer Nasr. The resource person conducted the workshop very effectively with her expertise and provided detailed and pertinent knowledge in a descriptive and comprehensive manner. Dr. Tanveer provided a structured approach to case formulation for clients with various symptoms. Real-life examples were used to illustrate the various steps involved and show how differences in approach to case formulation influence treatment decisions. This was followed by a more practical discussion of what information to include in a formulation for clients with disorders, the process of collaborating, generating, and sharing formulations through assessment and therapy and how to use formulations to determine treatment techniques. This gave the students an opportunity to ask questions related to their cases and gain deeper insight into the entire case report writing process and their therapeutic approaches.





Data presentation in Plant sciences has entered a new horizon and many online tools are there which make data presentation and visualization very effective and easy to understand. In three days, hands-on training sessions, Dr. Hafiza Mamona Nazir effectively explained Simple Statistics with respect to Plant Sciences in R Program (Graphics Bar, multiple bars, pie, lines, box plot, qqplot, Descriptive statistics, Mean, Median, Mode, quartile, decile, percentile, standard deviation, standard error, Correlation matrix Hypothesis (t, z, chi, f) test; Experimental Designs in Plant Sciences (Normality test, homogeneity test, ANOVA (CRD, RCBD, LSD, GLSD), ANCOVA, Linear regression model) and Advance Statistics in Plant Sciences including Cluster analysis, K-means, hierarchical, Principal component analysis, Factor analysis, and Logistic regression. Dr. Mamona Nazir addressed all the queries and questions from the participants and explained everything quite well.

On 3rd day after the session, Dr. Sajjad Hyder concluded the session and asked the faculty members, Ph.D. and MS students for their comments and feedback. All the participants appraised the training event and requested to continue organizing such events in future. 








First Position in Volleyball Champtionship Finals






Awareness Walk on "Violence against Women"




Gender Equality Today for a Sustainable Tomorrow: Seminar and Panel Discussion

Clean Water and Sanitization

The Government College Women University Sialkot provides free drinking water to the university population. The quality of water is tested regularly throughout the year and the filters are replaced on monthly basis to provide continuous supply of clean water.

The clean and waste water channels are separate so as to avoid entry of waste water in clean water reservoirs. The clean water reservoirs are regularly cleaned for proper maintenance of water channels.








AWARENESS OF HEPATITIS AND POLIO








Target I. Implement the IO-year framework

Target 2. Sustainable Management and Use of Natural Resources

Sustainable management is a key objective at GCWUS concerning waste and natural resources. The institute has developed various policies to accomplish these goals. One such policy extends its scope to equipment suppliers, stationery providers, and building contractors [1]. This policy aims to establish standard material specifications commonly used in universities, promoting a sustainable work environment and facilitating the sustainable procurement of products and services.





Target 3. Halve Global Per Capita Food Waste

Our institute aims to reduce food losses along production and supply chains, including post-harvest losses, by halving global per capita food waste at the retail and consumer levels.

Ethical Sourcing Policy of Food and Supply[2] defines the procedure of College Government Women University Sialkot for ethical sourcing of food and supply. It will focus on incorporating a sustainable responsible supply of food into the cafeteria.





Target 4. Chemical and Solid Waste Management



Chemical Waste Management

University has provided guidelines for the management of and other wastes chemicals generated in the lab and departments to control the air, water, and soil pollution to reduce its negative effects on human health and the environment significantly.



There are plans in place to reduce the usage of toxic chemicals and release other dangerous gases into the natural environment.

University is committed to improving the environmental conditions by assessing the positive and negative effects of waste generated on the campus and taking appropriate measures to avoid adverse effects due to lab work, construction, cafeteria, dispensary, or any other waste.

Disposal Policy[3] helps to Waste reduce landfill waste by using a waste management process in the University. The University sets some rules and procedures for its faculty, students and workers to help in the reduction of the amount of waste produced, segregate it into reusable and recycle waste to minimize landfill waste.

Target 5. Substantially Reduce Waste Generation

This target is being followed by the Government College Women University Sialkot. The Environmental Science Department is working to minimize waste generation significantly through prevention, reduction, recycling, and reuse.

This is implemented by the placement of recycling containers in different locations of the university. Bins of various colors are placed: paper and cardboard waste are collected in blue bins. Glass bottles and jars are collected in green colored bins. Bottles and packaging made of plastic are collected in red bins.

Policy for Minimization of Disposable Items [4] aimed to minimize the disposable items such as straws, wrappers, spoons, glass etc. Campus planned to achieve this goal by replacing disposable items used at the university's canteen and labs with alternatives that are sustainable and eco-friendly.







Minimization of Plastic Waste at University [5] aimed to make a zero-plastic environment at university and to introduce eco-friendly products and alternatives of plastic products in GCWUS. The main target of our action plan is to minimize plastic waste by reusing, recycling, and holding awareness campaigns at the university.









This policy aims to encourage students to participate in plastic reuse and recycling practices."

Target 6. Encourage Companies to Adopt Sustainable Practices and Sustainability Reporting

GCWUS aspires to achieve this goal through cooperating with companies who use sustainable practices and report on them, whether they are in the food supply or stationery industries. Policy on Ethical Sourcing Policy Food and Supply [6] defines the ethical sourcing of food and supply in the cafeteria of Government College Women University Sialkot. It focus on incorporating sustainable and responsible supply of food into the cafeteria.

Policy on Extension in Outsourcing Services [7] ensures energy-efficient services from outside which generate less waste and should be enduring. It should be managed in a way that does not effect human health and the surrounding environment.

The journal considers submissions on plant biology (including ecology, evolution, physiology, biodiversity, systematics, development, genetics, paleobotany, structure, and function), all levels of organization (ecosystem to molecular), ethnobotany, plant environment, and Plant Pathology, plant bacteriology, plant mycology, plant virology, plant nematology, and epidemiology.

Workshop on Combined Effluent Treatment Plant for Sialkot Tannery Zone(STZ)

Mr. Waseem Ahsan Cheema, Director Environment Protection Department, Govt. of Punjab, President Sialkot Chamber, Chairman & CEO STAGL, Leather community, civil society Govt. Officials and PhD doctors along with BS final year students of Departments of Environmental Sciences and Chemistry from GC Women University Sialkot attended the workshop.

Officially opening the workshop, Mr. Sarfraz Bhatti, Chairman STAGL, applauded the initiative taken by UNIDO-GEF in promoting the mitigation strategy for Climate Change. He also highlighted the collaboration between Tannery Zone and Sialkot Chamber for spearheading the development of leather sector of Pakistan. Mr. Ahtesham Gillani, CEO STAGL appreciated the personal interest taken by EPD Punjab for supporting project activities in realizing the objectives common of leather sector development

The Chief Guest Mr. Waseem Ahsan Cheema appreciated the theme of workshop and stressed all members to relocate in newly established tannery zone with world class effluent treatment facility, he promised to support Tannery Zone Project with full zeal.

The purpose of this awareness workshop was to help tanners, tannery managers and other direct/indirect stakeholders to get acquainted with basic principles and methods of tannery effluent treatment and to describe that the design of an effluent treatment plant (ETP) is always tailored to the requirements of a specific site.







During the said Workshop the consultant NEC from Karachi presented detailed process design to all stakeholders at Sialkot Chamber of Commerce & Industry (SCCI) on developing better understanding of CETP including modular approach with expected pollution load and operating cost. The main objective of the workshop was to share the updated status of CETP and process efficiency of the plant. The proposed CETP plant is the first plant in Pakistan for leather sector having separate Sulphide Oxidation as Primary treatment and utilization of heavy metal for Sludge for Agriculture which will help the tanners in LWG (Leather Working Group) compliance and boost leather export for Pakistan.

Mr. Shujauddin Siddiqui, Leather expert elaborated chromium management in tanneries which causes environmental pollution and presented the ways by which Effluent of chrome is re-useable.

The workshop also provided a platform for discussing problems, new ideas, and concepts relating to treatment plant. The workshop facilitated in building local capacity with regard to understanding of CETP, its functions and would provide a platform for collection of information on making final comments and identification of gaps if would be Furthermore, the confidence of stakeholders will be enhanced that project is progressing towards its final destination. The whole workshop was managed by the Internees from GC Women University Sialkot's students of Environmental Sciences. CEO Tannery Zone appreciated the important role of industry academia linkages through which an effective R&D can be established for producing world class products for the International Markets. He also appreciated the role of ORIC for bringing learned and motivated workforce to the door steps of STAGL.

The participants actively participated in the event and raised several pertinent technical questions. In brief, the session identified the potential areas of awareness about climate change mitigation with clear indication of needed sector specific intervention.


