### Statutory Bodies of University

#### Syndicate

1. The Syndicate shall consist of—

1. Pro-Chancellor who shall be its chairperson;
2. Vice Chancellor;
3. Pro-Vice Chancellor;
4. Secretary to the Government, Higher Education Department or a nominee not below the rank of Additional Secretary;
5. Secretary to the Government, Finance Department or a nominee not below the rank of Additional Secretary;
6. Secretary to the Government, Law and Parliamentary Affairs Department or a nominee not below the rank of Additional Secretary;
7. Chairman of the Commission or a nominee not below the rank of a whole time member of the Commission;
8. one Vice Chancellor of any public University of the Punjab to be nominated by the Chancellor;
9. Three senior most Deans of the faculty to be nominated by the Chancellor;
10. Three persons [2][including at least one woman] of eminence to be nominated by the Chancellor;
11. Chairman Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Gujranwala;
12. Two Principals of constituent colleges to be nominated by the Government;
13. Two Principals of affiliated colleges to be nominated by the Government; and
14. Three women members of the Provincial Assembly of the Punjab to be nominated by the Speaker of the Assembly.

2. The Registrar shall be the Secretary of the Syndicate.

3. The Pro-Chancellor may nominate a member of the Syndicate to preside over a meeting of the Syndicate in the absence of the Pro-Chancellor.
4. The members of the Syndicate, other than ex-officio members, shall hold office for three years.
5. Eight members of the Syndicate shall constitute the quorum for a meeting of the Syndicate.
6. The Registrar shall, with the approval of the chairperson of the Syndicate, summon a meeting of the Syndicate.
7. The Syndicate shall take decision by majority of the votes of members present and voting and the Registrar shall clearly reflect in the minutes of the meeting the dissent, if any, along with the reasons of such dissent.

## **Powers and Duties of the Syndicate**

- 1) The Syndicate shall be the executive body of the University and shall, subject to the provisions of this Act and statutes, take effective measures to—
  1. Finance and Planning raise the standard of teaching, research, technological development, publication and other academic pursuits and exercise general supervision over the affairs of the University and management of the property of the University.
- 2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers and subject to the provisions of this Act, the Syndicate may—
  1. Hold, control and administer the property and funds of the University;
  2. Govern and regulate, with due regard to the advice of the Finance and Planning Committee in this behalf, the finances, accounts, and investments of the University and for that purpose, to appoint such agents as it may deem fit;
  3. Consider and approve the annual report, the annual and revised budget estimates and to re-appropriate funds from one major head of expenditure to another;
  4. Transfer and accept transfer of movable or immovable property on behalf of the University;
  5. Enter, vary, carry out or cancel contracts on behalf of the University;
  6. Cause proper books of account to be kept for all sums of money received and expended by the University and for the assets and liabilities of the University;
  7. Invest any money belonging to the University including any unapplied income in any of the securities described in section 20 of the Trusts Act 1882 (II of 1882), or in the purchase of immovable property or in such other manner, as it may determine, with the like power of varying such investments;
  8. Receive and manage any property transferred, grants, bequests, trusts, gifts, donations, endowments and other contributions made to the University;
  9. Determine the form, custody, and regulation of the use of the Common Seal of the University;
  10. Provide buildings, libraries, premises, furniture, apparatus, equipment's, and other means required for carrying out the work of the University;
  11. Establish and maintain halls of residence and hostels or approve or license hostels or lodgings for the residence of students;
  12. Affiliate or disaffiliate Colleges and Institutes;

13. Admit educational institutions to the privileges of the University and withdraw such privileges;
14. Arrange for the inspection of the academic departments;
15. Institute Professorships, Associate Professorships, Assistant Professorships, Lecturer ships' and other posts and to suspend or abolish such posts;
16. Create, suspend or abolish such administrative, technical, research, extension or other posts as may be necessary;
17. Appoint University teachers and other officers on the recommendation of the Selection Board for teaching and other managerial posts;
18. Confer with prior approval of the Chancellor, an honorary degree;
19. Prescribe the duties of the officers, teachers, and other employees of the University and of those working in the University on deputation or on contract;
20. Appoint members to the various Authorities, Committees, and Bodies in a prescribed manner;
21. Remove any person from membership of any authority if such person has accepted any assignment which involves absence from University for a continuous period of six months or more;
22. Regulate, determine and administer, all other matters concerning the University and do this end exercise all necessary powers not specifically mentioned in this Act and statutes but not inconsistent with the provisions of the Act;
23. appoint Professor Emeritus on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed;
24. Suspend, punish and remove from service in the prescribed manner officers, teachers and employees whom it is empowered to appoint;
25. Consider and approve regulations recommended by the Academic Council;
26. Approve statutes and recommend those drafts of the statutes, for approval of the Chancellor, which pertain to terms and conditions of service of the University employees;
27. Delegate any of its powers to an Authority or officer or a committee or sub-committee; and
28. Perform such other functions as may be assigned to it under the Act and the statutes.

## Academic Council

1. The Academic Council shall consist of–
  1. Vice Chancellor who shall be its Chairperson;
  2. Deans;
  3. chairpersons;
  4. three Principals of affiliated colleges nominated by the Syndicate;
  5. all Professors including Professors Emeritus;
  6. two Associate Professors, two Assistant Professors and two lecturers to be elected from amongst themselves;
  7. three persons [3] [including at least one woman] of eminence to be nominated by the Syndicate;
  8. Secretary to the Government, Higher Education Department or a nominee not below the rank of Deputy Secretary;
  9. five experts [4] [including at least two female experts] in the field of education to be nominated by the Chancellor;
  10. Registrar (Member/Secretary);
  11. Controller of Examinations; and
  12. Librarian of the University.
2. The members of the Academic Council, other than ex-officio members, shall hold office for three years; and if the office of any such member becomes vacant before the expiry of the term, the vacancy shall be filled for the remaining period in the prescribed manner.
3. The quorum for a meeting of the Academic Council shall be one-third of the total number of members, a fraction being counted as one.

### Powers and duties of the Academic Council

1. The Academic Council shall be the academic body of the University and may lay down proper standards of instruction, research, publication, and examination and to regulate and promote the academic life of the University and affiliated colleges.
2. And without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions, the Academic Council may:
  1. Advise the Syndicate on academic matters;
  2. Regulate teaching, research, and examinations;
  3. Regulate the admission of students to the courses of studies and examinations of the University and affiliated colleges;
  4. Regulate the award of studentships, scholarships, medals, and prizes;
  5. Regulate the conduct and discipline of students of the University and affiliated colleges;
  6. Propose to the Syndicate schemes for the constitution and organization of faculties, institutes, and other academic bodies;

7. Propose regulations on the recommendations of the Boards of Faculties and the Boards of Studies for consideration and approval of the Syndicate;
8. Propose for each academic year, on the recommendations of the Boards of Studies, regulations prescribing the courses of studies, the syllabi, and the outlines of tests for all examinations; provided that, if the recommendations of a Board of Faculties or the Board of Studies are not received by the prescribed date, the Academic Council may, subject to the approval of the Syndicate, permit such regulations to continue for the following years;
9. Recognize the examinations of other Universities or examining bodies as equivalent to the corresponding examinations of the University;
10. Appoint members to the Authorities in accordance with the provisions of this Act; and
11. Perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the statutes.

## **Board of Advanced Studies and Research**

1. The Board of Advanced Studies and Research shall consist of–
  1. Vice Chancellor (Chairperson);
  2. All the Deans;
  3. Controller of Examinations;
  4. one University Professor from each faculty to be nominated by the Syndicate;
  5. one member to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor;
  6. three members from the relevant field, research organizations and Government, to be nominated by the Syndicate; and
  7. Registrar (Secretary).
2. The term of office of the members of the Board of Advanced Studies and Research other than ex-officio members shall be three years.
3. The quorum for a meeting of the Board of Advanced Studies and Research shall be one half of the total number of members.

## **Functions of the Board of Advanced Studies and Research**

The Board of Advanced Studies and Research shall–

1. Advise an Authority on all matters connected with the promotion of advanced studies and research publication in the University;
2. Consider and report to an Authority with regard to a research degree of the University;
3. propose regulations regarding the award of a research degree;
4. Appoint supervisors for a postgraduate research student and to approve title and synopsis of a thesis or dissertation;
5. Recommend panels of names of examiners for evaluation of a research examination; and
6. Perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the statutes.



## Selection Board

1. The Selection Board shall consist of–
  1. Vice Chancellor (Chairperson);
  2. Dean of the faculty concerned;
  3. chairperson concerned;
  4. one [5] [female] member of the Syndicate to be nominated by the Syndicate;
  5. one eminent scholar to be nominated by the Syndicate;
  6. two experts [6] [including at least one female expert] to be nominated by the Government; and
  7. Registrar (Secretary).
2. The members other than ex-officio members shall hold office for a period of three years.
3. Five members including at least one expert shall constitute the quorum for a meeting of the Selection Board.
4. No member who is a candidate or whose family member is a candidate, for a post to which appointment is to be made, shall take part in the proceedings of the Selection Board for selection of a candidate on such post.
5. In selection of candidates for the post of Professor or Associate Professor, the Selection Board shall co-opt or consult three experts in the subject and in selecting candidates for any other teaching post, two experts in the subject, to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor from a standing list of experts for each subject approved by the Syndicate.
6. The Syndicate may approve or revise the standing list of experts of a subject on the recommendation of the Selection Board.

### Functions of the Selection

The Selection Board shall–

1. consider the applications and recommend to the Syndicate, the names of suitable candidates for appointment to teaching and other posts and recommend suitable salary for the selected candidate; and
2. consider all cases of promotion or selection of officers of the University and recommend the names of suitable candidates for such promotion or selection to the Syndicate.

## **Finance and Planning Committee**

1. The Finance and Planning Committee shall consist of–
  1. Vice Chancellor (Chairperson);
  2. all the Deans;
  3. one member of the Syndicate to be nominated by the Syndicate;
  4. one member of the Academic Council to be nominated by the Academic Council;
  5. one representative each from Higher Education Department and Finance Department of the Government not below the rank of a Deputy Secretary;
  6. Director Planning or any other nominee of the Commission;
  7. Registrar; and
  8. Treasurer (Secretary).
2. The term of office of the nominated members shall be three years.
3. Five members of the Finance and Planning Committee shall constitute the quorum for a meeting of the Finance and Planning Committee.

### **The Finance and Planning Committee shall**

1. prepare the annual statement of accounts and propose annual budget estimates and make recommendations to the Syndicate;
2. review periodically the financial position of the University;
3. advise the Syndicate on all matters relating to finance, investments and accounts of the University; and
4. perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the statutes.

## College

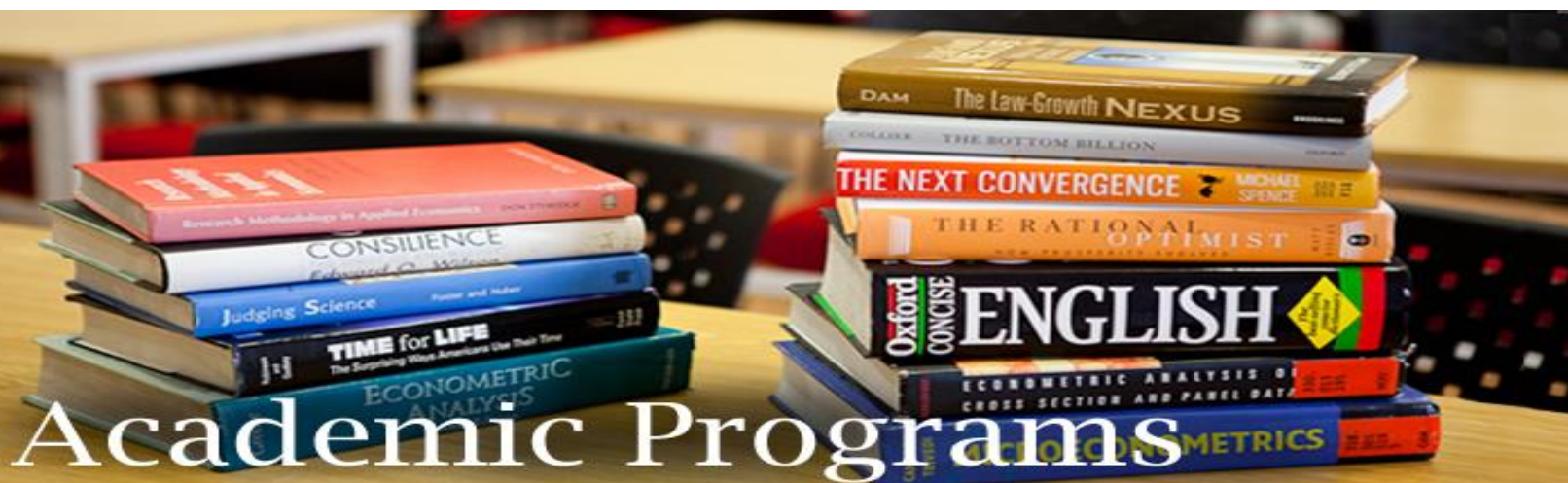

## First Women University in Sialkot

BS Hons. 4 Years Degree Program was introduced by the Higher Education Department in 2010. Keeping in view its immense educational growth rate, it attained the status of First Women University in Sialkot and was renamed as the Government College Women University, Sialkot. Granted its own charter in 2012 vide Govt. of the Punjab ACT 2012 (VII of 2013). Prof. Dr. Nizamuddin, Vice Chancellor UOG took charge of GCWU, Sialkot on 18th March 2014. Prof. Dr. Farhat Saleemi joined as Vice Chancellor on 12th Sept. 2014.

# Library Resources

## Learning Resources

## Registrar office

Registrar office of GCWU Sialkot acts as a supervisory body and as a support system within University, aiding in the execution and application of rules and regulations, recommendations, and other administrative tasks. The foremost goal of GCWU's registrar's office is to ensure a balanced and fair working environment with an equal distribution of work. The Registrar's office is liable to make smooth the academic experience of the students of GCWU, Sialkot, from the registration to their graduation. It helps to manage academic and administrative policies; as well as offer assistance in the development or revision of university policies and procedures.

## Treasurer office

The Treasurer's office has the most important task of managing the university's financial assets and liabilities. It is exclusively responsible for managing the finances of G.C.W.U.S with complete honesty, wisdom and foresight for the betterment and expansion of the university. The treasurer's office is also under obligation to ensure production and payroll deduction disbursements. This office also deals with the various applications related to fee submission, late submission of fee, refund of securities, payment of fine, duplicate semester results, thesis extension, convocation registration and gown security etcetera.

## Controller Of Examination

The office of the Controller of examinations is chiefly responsible for the conduction of exam in well-organized manner. This entails the preparation of date sheet, examination schedules, processing of transcripts, degrees & certificates. Thus, the controller Office is in charge of all the matters related to examinations.

### **Core Functions performed by the Office of the Controller of Examinations:**

1. Conduction of examinations.

2. Compilation & declaration of Semester results.
3. Issuance of Transcripts, Degrees & Detail Marks certificate (DMC).
4. Deal with unfair mean cases.
5. Keep record of Student's result and ensure departmental secrecy.

## Quality Enhancement Cell

Main purpose of QEC is to ensure maximum quality work regarding research, studies, and teaching facilities. To fulfil this purpose and to induce standards of excellence, it is necessary to provide channels and particular trainings to the members (students, faculties and staff). These objectives will be achieved by providing necessary trainings at all levels. Hierarchal and gradually training process will be adopted to make members familiarize with the basic aims, ideas and components of QEC. As training workshops are the one of the few necessary elements of QEC.

## Office of Research, Innovation, and Commercialization

The Office of Research, Innovation & Commercialization (ORIC) is establishing at GC Women University Sialkot. # ADMISSIONS

## Post-Graduate Program

Government College Women University shall offer Ph.D. programs, duly approved by HEC, for female students in all faculties

### **(i) Admission Policy:**

Admission will be carried out once a year after the announcement of results of MS programs. The admission will be purely on merit basis.

### **(ii) Eligibility Criteria** for PhD program (as per HEC guidelines) is as follows:

1. A minimum CGPA of 3.0 (out of 4.0 in the semester system) or 1<sup>st</sup> division (in annual system) in MS/M. Phil/Equivalent degree is required.
2. A subject test conducted by National Testing Service (NTS) or ETS, USA in specialization chosen at the PhD level must be cleared prior to admission for the PhD program.
  - i. In case of GAT Subject test a minimum of 60% marks is required to pass the test.
  - ii. In case of GRE Subject a minimum percentile score of 60% is required
  - iii. If the test is not available in NTS subject list, then a University committee consisting of at least 3 PhD faculty members in the subject area and approved by the HEC will conduct the test at par with GRE Subject test and qualifying score will be 70%.
3. The admission will be advertised in national newspapers and on University website.
4. The candidates will apply to the relevant teaching department through admission committee. The departmental doctoral committee chaired by chairperson of the department will scrutinize the application forms and synopsis of research plan and interview the candidate for suitability for research.

On successfully satisfying the departmental doctoral committee, the candidate will be registered as PhD student in the relevant department.

**Two marks will be deducted from the marks obtained out of 100 marks for each late year to a maximum of two years**

## Graduate Program

Government College Women University shall offer MS programs, duly approved by HEC, for female students in all faculties.

i. **Admission Policy:**

Admission will be carried out once a year after the announcement of results of BS programs. The admission will be purely on merit basis.

- ii. **Eligibility Criteria** for MS program (as per HEC guidelines) is as follows:
- a. Sixteen years of education will be required for admission in MS programs.
  - b. A minimum CGPA of 2.5 (out of 4 in the semester system and 1<sup>st</sup> division in annual system in undergraduate degree is required.)
  - c. A University committee consisting of at least 2 PhD members in the subject area will conduct a subject test at par with NTS-GAT test and qualifying score will be 60%.
- iii. The admission will be advertised in national newspapers and on University website.
- iv. The candidates will apply to the relevant teaching department through admission committee. The departmental admission committee will scrutinize the application forms and interview the candidate for suitability.
- v. On successfully satisfying the departmental admission committee, the candidate will be registered as MS student in the relevant department.

**Two marks will be deducted from the marks obtained out of 100 marks for each late year to a maximum of two years**

**b) Eligibility Criteria**

1. The candidates seeking admission to the M.A/M.Sc. Classes must have B.A / B.Sc. (14 years) from any public / private institution at least in 2nd division. The Private students are also eligible to apply.
2. The students must have studied the major subject B.A / B.Sc. level (in which she is seeking admission).
3. All the students may apply for BS English and I.T however the students who have studied English Literature will be given preference.

**Two marks will be deducted from the marks obtained out of 100 marks for each late year to a maximum of two years**

## **BS Degree**

**Eligibility Criteria of BS degree**

1. The candidates seeking admission to the B.S. Classes must have passed Intermediate or A level examination from any public / private institution at least in 2nd division. The Private students are also eligible to apply.
2. The students must have studied the major subject at intermediate level (in which she is seeking admission).
3. The candidates who have not studied Mathematics at intermediate level are not eligible to apply for BS Mathematics.
4. All the students may apply for BS English, however the students who have studied English Literature will be given preference.
5. The candidates applying for Fine Arts and Design & Visual Arts will have to qualify an aptitude test.
6. The subjects like Islamic Studies, Urdu, Pakistan studies, International Relations, Political science and Sociology are open for all students
7. Only I. Com qualified students are eligible to apply for B. Com and BBA
8. The students are allowed to change their major subjects on merit only within seven working days after commencement of classes.

**Supplementary cases are not eligible to apply**

**Two marks will be deducted from the marks obtained out of 100 marks for each late year to a maximum of two years.**

## Admission Procedure

1. The applicants may obtain admission forms along with the prospectus from the office of the main campus, Sialkot and the offices of affiliated colleges and sub campuses on the day duly notified and advertised.
2. They are required to fill out the form in their own handwriting.
3. The agreement at the back of the form must be signed by the applicant as well as by the parent or guardian.
4. They are directed to attach the attested photocopies of the following documents with the form

- Matriculation / O-Level Certificate
  - Detailed Marks Card of F. A/F. Sc./A-level Certificate
  - Equivalence Certificates issued by IBCC
  - Provisional character certificate from the institution last attended
  - CNIC of the Candidate as well as Father/Guardian
  - Monthly income certificate of Father/ Guardian
  - Domicile Certificate
5. The University will display a list of the provisionally selected candidates on the University Notice Board and/or the University website.
  6. The selected candidates will pay / deposit admission fee and other dues within the notified dates, otherwise their admission will automatically stand cancelled.
  7. After the display of merit list, all the selected applicants are required to bring the original documents, one set of attested photocopy of these documents and four photographs at the time of depositing the dues.
  8. The selected candidates will be admitted provisionally and the verification committee will confirm admission after the verification of the documents. If at any stage after the admission it comes to the knowledge of the authorities that the documents presented by the applicant are fake or there is a misstatement or clerical error in the document, her admission will be cancelled.



# Financial Policies and Financial Assistance

## Fee concession & scholarship policy of GCWUS

Considering the poor financial situation of the parents in Sialkot and its suburbs, the University has decided to help such students who could not afford the tuition fee of different degree programs introduced by the University. For this purpose, the University will adopt the following policy by introducing different schemes:

### 1. Scheme of fee concession:

- Fee waiver in tuition fee, up to 10% of the total enrolled students in the first semester, will be granted @ 100%, 75%, 50% and 25% on their first admission in the University.
- For this purpose, the students have to fill a form along with admission form seeking financial help from the University.
- When the admission process will complete all the application form seeking the financial help will be referred to the committee to assess the financial position of the parents of the applicant.

- The committee will interview all the applicants and recommend accordingly.
- If the Committee feels that the students fall in the deserving and needy category it may recommend 25% to 100% fee concession and send the case to the Treasurer.
- The Treasurer on receipt of recommendation and considering the availability of funds, may allow the fee concession to the student in the First Semester.
- The student will be given lesser fee challan (as per fee waiver) considering her Financial position.
- The subject fee concession shall continue only if the student continues to gain CGPA of 3.00 and above in each semester.
- In case of dropping the CGPA below 3.00 the facility of fee concession shall be discontinued.
- In case of CGPA more than 3.00 in the entire degree period, the student will receive the benefits of fee concession till the completion of degree program.

### **Scheme of Fee Instalment**

- By following the procedure as elaborated at 1 of fee concession scheme, in case where the Committee feels that the student can manage the fee within the semester as per her parents' financial position, it may recommend the fee in two instalments.
- The Committee will record on the application of the student for grant of fee in two instalments and send the case to the treasurer office.
- The Treasurer will allow the Fee Instalments by issuing the fee challan to the student for deposit of fee in Instalments.

### Credit Hour

1. A credit hour means teaching a theory course for one hour each week throughout the Semester.
2. One credit hour in laboratory or practical work / project would require lab contact of two hours per week throughout the semester.
3. The credit hours are denoted by two digits within brackets with a Plus in between. The first Digit represents the theory part while the second (right side) digit represents the practical. Thus 3(3+0) means three credit hours of theory, while 4(3+1) means a total of four credit Hours, of which three are of theory while one credit hour is for laboratory.
4. The weekly contact hours of a 3(3+0) course will be three, the contact hours of a 4(3+1) Course will be six.
5. The contact hours during each week of the Summer Session will be doubled to ensure that the course is completely taught in a semester with half the duration compared with a regular (Fall/Spring) semester.

## Credit Transfer Policy

GCWUS accepts credit transfer requests of students from other HEC recognized Universities. A kind of holistic assessment, based on consideration of the following is employed by GCWUS in this regard, for suitability of the credit transfer:

**(i) Compatibility**

A course not part of the GCWUS program/ curriculum, shall not be transferred.

**(ii) Academic Achievements**

Courses with less than grade C for undergraduate and grade B for graduate shall not be entitled for the credit transfer.

**(iii) Academic Reference**

NOC and transcript from the previous University.

(iv) All credit transfer applicants must also meet the standard entry Criteria for GC Women University, Sialkot.

**(v) Representation**

A transferred course shall be shown by “T” on the transcript and shall not be counted in the CGPA/GPA calculations.

**How – where – when to apply for the Credit Transfer:**

- Use application form for the credit transfer available from the SSC and GCWUS website [www.gcwus.edu.pk](http://www.gcwus.edu.pk)
- Fill up the form completely.
- Form is supported with
  - NOC
  - Courses(s) outlines
  - Transcript for the previous University
- However, in case of credit transfer within the University is requested, no course outline is required: all passed courses will be transferred to the Major, the student requested for.
- Submit the application at the SSC, from where it will be forwarded to the program Director and the Registrar for their approval, if and when it is approved and received, it is proceeded at the SSC accordingly for the credit transfer.

All such applications need to be submitted before start of classes of a semester, to give ample time for processing of the application



## Admission

The number of seats available for admission in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester for each Academic year/session and other requirements regarding eligibility of candidates for admission shall be such as announced by the University through the University Admission Policy amended from time to time. Unless otherwise provided in the relevant prospectus, admission shall be made strictly on the basis of academic record and admission test to be conducted by the university.

### **(i) Change of Discipline**

One week after the commencement of classes University will provide facility for changing discipline  
If student meets the defined merit.

### **(ii) Admission By Migration**

Under extraordinary circumstances the Vice Chancellor, on the recommendation of the migration committee may allow migration of a student as per Migration Rules amended from time to time.

## Repeating of Course

- a) A student will be allowed to repeat in the following manner, a course in which she was absent or has secured cumulative “F” grade whenever the course is offered.
  - (i) Candidate who had appeared in surprise test, quiz, assignment and Mid-term Examinations but remained absent in Final Term Examination or could not secure 50% marks shall repeat the course whenever the course is offered.
  - (ii) Candidate who remained absent through out and did not take the examination shall be required to repeat all the subjects by readmission.
- b) Permission for repeating a course will be given by the Dean on the recommendation of the Chairperson concerned.

## Freezing a Semester Re-admission and Leave

- (i) A student may discontinue her studies by freezing a semester with the permission of Chairperson concerned due to illness duly certified by a district hospital countersigned by the University Medical Officer. The Chairperson concerned would intimate the same to the Dean and Controller of Examinations.
- (ii) A student may also discontinue under the circumstances beyond her control to be determined by the Chairperson concerned, in each case on a written application by the student. The Chairperson concerned with prior approval of Dean shall duly notify it accordingly under intimation to Controller of Examinations.

- (iii) A student can discontinue only if discontinuation is sought prior to enrolment in the second or subsequent semester, the student shall have not to pay the dues.
- (iv) A student who seeks discontinuation shall have to enrol in the program offered by the department as per the courses of studies in vogue at that time.
- (v) Discontinuation shall not be allowed for more than two times in whole degree program in any case. A student who discontinues with the permission may enrol in the same semester the following year with the written permission from Head of the Department concerned.
- (vi) In general, a discontinuing student will be allowed to start the studies where she left off. But in special circumstances, where the program has been discontinued or re-designed, the Dean shall have the final authority regarding re-admission of the student.
- (vii) The Batch/Session of the discontinuing student shall remain unchanged.

## Leave

For a prolonged/ extraordinary leave of more than one semester, the student shall apply for leave with a valid reason approved by the program Director. Leave application shall be submitted before a semester starts. The student will not have to pay any charges during leave. Leave is valid for two semesters. After the two semesters, the student shall re-join, register in courses and continue studies, failing which her admission shall be cancelled automatically, without any prior information/ intimation.

## Grades

Grades given to a student in each course shall

be of two types:

- (i) Numerical Grades:

Assessment of performance on the basis of marks fixed for a course of any credit Hours Unit, shall be termed Numerical grade (NG).

- (ii) Alphabetical Grades:

Equivalent of numerical grade in terms of alphabets shall be termed as Alphabetical Grade (AG). Each letter carries a value in terms of numerical points of Grade point (GP).

## Grade Point Average

### **Cumulative Grade Point Average**

- The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be calculated at the end of the second semester and each of the subsequent semesters.
- If a student fails to make up the deficiency in her Cumulative Grade Point Average in given the number of chances permitted, she will cease to be on the rolls of the university.

Semester Grade Point Average (GPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Averages (C. GPAs) will be Calculated using the following relationships:

$$\text{GPA} = \frac{\text{Sum over Courses in Semester (Course Credit Hours X Grade Point Earned)}}{\text{Total Semester Credit Hours}}$$

$$\text{C.GPA} = \frac{\text{Sum over all taken Courses in all Semesters (Course Credit Hours X Grade Point Earned)}}{\text{Total Credit Hours Taken in all Semesters}}$$

## Evaluation

- a) The evaluation of the students shall be done by following assessment methods for each course during each Semester. These shall be termed.
  - i. Quiz, Surprise Test, Assignment, Presentation,
  - ii. Mid-Term test
  - iii. Semester Examination and or Practical /Lab Examination.

### Quiz/Surprise Test/Assignment/Presentation

- a) At least two Assignments and two surprise tests and random quizzes shall be given in each course during one semester.  
The first assignment and first surprise test shall be given, collected and assessed during.  
3<sup>rd</sup>. & 5<sup>th</sup> week and the Second assignment and second surprise test shall be given, collected and assessed during 12<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> week of the semester and the result finalized after Inviting objections one week before termination of the courses. The students may be asked to give presentations as and when required by the teacher In addition, random quizzes shall also be given as decided by the concerned teacher.
- b) If student fails to submit an Assignment on the due date, on account of any genuine reason, the teacher concerned may allow her to submit the same within the next one week. Assignments shall not be accepted for evaluation after one week of the due date.
- c) In case a student fails in a surprise test/quiz or is absent, the same shall not be re-conducted whatever may be the reason.

### Mid-Term test

- a) There shall be a Mid-Term Test in a course during a semester, which shall be held during the 9<sup>th</sup> week after the commencement of the Semester.
- b) The duration of the Midterm Test shall not be more than two hours.
- c) The conduct (fixing of time, date and place) of Mid-term Test shall be the responsibility of the Chairperson concerned department with the consultation of Dean.
- d) There shall be no separate Mid-term test for failures or repeat test for absentees on any account.
- e) The scripts of Mid-term tests shall be shown to the students after evaluation/marking. The award lists/marks sheets of the tests will be displayed on the Notice board of the Department immediately after evaluation. A copy of the award

lists of these tests will also be submitted by the teacher/examiner to the Chairperson of the department concerned.

- f) If any student is not satisfied with the evaluation of Mid-term Test, she may represent to the chairperson of the concerned Department within 7 working days of the declaration of the result. The decision of the Chairperson after consulting the examiner concerned in the matter shall be final. Any representation after the expiry of 7 working days will not be entertained. The final award list of Mid-term Tests along with the marks of Assignment, tests shall be forwarded by the teachers to the Chairperson concerned within two weeks of the Final Semester Examination. The Marks so communicated to the Chairperson shall be final and no subsequent change shall be permitted.

### **Practical Examination/Lab**

#### **Examination**

The Practical/Lab.

Examination may include:

- i. Journals, Reports-Evaluation.
- ii. Practical, Viva-Voce Examination.

### **Final Term Examination**

1. The Examination in all the courses shall be conducted by the Controller of Examinations.
2. The Examination shall be open to a student who has been on the rolls of the University provided that her examination form is duly certified and forwarded by the Chairperson of the Department.
3. The duration of Examination in all the courses (irrespective of the number of credit hours) shall not be more than three hours except engineering drawing, which shall be of maximum four hours.
4. The Examination shall be held at the end of each semester. Preparation leave shall be allowed to the students after the completion of 16 weeks teaching period and before the commencement of Semester Examination as decided by the university.
5. The Examination schedule / Program shall be prepared by the Controller of examinations in consultation with the Chairperson of the department concerned and approved by the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the Dean
6. The Examination schedule / program shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations at least one week in advance of the commencement of the Examination.
7. After holding the semester examination each teacher shall prepare three copies of the result/awards on the prescribed award list. She shall retain one copy with her, shall send one copy to the Head of the Department and last to the Controller of Examinations along with scripts and question paper. The Controller of Examinations shall prepare the final result and submit it to the Vice Chancellor for approval. After

approval, the result shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations and a copy of the same shall be submitted to the Dean. Results of each semester along with scripts shall be forwarded to Controller of Examinations, within the prescribed period as mentioned in Examinations Rules.

8. The Controller of Examinations shall be responsible for compilation/tabulation of the results and for submitting it to the Vice Chancellor for approval before its announcement.
9. The Controller of Examinations shall issue Marks / Grade certificate to each individual student appearing in the examination on the prescribed form and fees after declaration of the results on the request of the student.
10. For the programs / degrees where research is optional, the students are required to submit the Thesis / Project report within two months from the date of last examination of the final semester. However, this time duration can be extended with the permission of the Head of the concerned Department. The evaluation of the project shall be made by the panel of three examiners comprising the Head, external examiner (to be recommended by the concerned Chairperson and Dean and appointed by the Vice Chancellor) and the concerned faculty member under whose supervision the Thesis/Project is completed

### **Distribution of Marks for each Course**

\*Assignment for the course/s where only practical work is involved shall include usual assignment, individual/ group tasks and mini projects.

\*\*Semester examination for the course/s where only practical work is involved shall include written as well oral examination decided by the concerned teacher, and individual/group project.



## Promotion Rule

1. A student must obtain a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.00 at the end of each semester for promotion to the next semester.
2. In case a student is able to obtain GPA of 1.70 or more but less than 2.00 except first semester where GPA of 1.50 or more but less than 2.0, she will be promoted to the next Semester on probation (1st probation). If the student does not achieve the desired CGPA of 2.0 but obtains CGPA greater than or equal to 1.7, will go to the 2<sup>nd</sup> (last) probation. The candidate, who fails to secure 1.50 GPA in the first semester or 1.70 CGPA in a subsequent semester, will stand automatically dropped from the rolls of the University.
3. A student will have the right to avail probation twice in the following semesters.
4. A student has to obtain CGPA 2.00 in the last semester of each program for the award of the degree.
5. In the first, third, fifth and seventh semesters a student will be required to repeat those courses of the first, third, fifth and seventh semesters, respectively, in which she had failed.
6. In the second, fourth, sixth and eighth semester, a student will be required to repeat those courses of the second, fourth, sixth and eighth semesters, respectively, in which she had failed.
7. If a student gets D grade, she can repeat the course when offered to improve her grade.

## Paper View

- (i) Proper Paper Viewing has to be made mandatory before final submission of result to the controller of examinations and its approval by the Faculty Board of Studies.
- (ii) This would help in avoiding student grievances, biasness and calculation errors etc. in the papers.

## Class Attendance

- (i) At the end of each Semester the Teacher concerned shall send attendance record to the Dean, through the Chairperson of Department concerned, a statement giving the total number of lectures delivered and practical conducted by her together with the total number of lectures and practical attended by each student in her charge.
- (ii) A candidate with less than 80% attendance in Class lectures and lab work will not be allowed to appear in the Semester Examination in a semester. For genuine reasons the Dean of the faculty of Engineering may condone 5% shortage in attendance on the recommendations of the Chairperson of the Department. In exceptional cases the Vice Chancellor may further condone 5% shortage in attendance on the recommendations of the Dean. Beyond this limit the academic council shall be the

competent authority.

- (iii) In the case of a sportsperson participating in games of ***National or International*** level, as verified by the Director sports and recommended by Chairperson concerned, the attendance in class lectures and lab. work will be calculated on the basis of total number of lectures delivered/practical conducted in a course minus the number of total lecture days actually spent by the sportsperson in representing the university in sports or games.
- (iv) In the case of persons who are selected by the government or the university for proceeding on good-will missions outside the City/Province/Country, the lectures delivered in the concerned classes during the period of absence of such persons not exceeding 15 days shall be deducted from the total number of lectures delivered to the class and the required percentage of attendance for purpose of examinations shall be based on the balance of lectures.

### Promotion to Higher Class

Candidate in a particular Semester shall be allowed to proceed to the next Semester provisionally on the following basis.
